                                 This fire is not punitive, but purgative = to refine (cf. 1:7, tested by fire)
                           b] for demonstrating the genuineness of one's faith (1:6-7; cp. Mt 13:20-21)
                           c] for promoting spiritual growth (Hebr 12:10b, 11b)
                        ii) [13] keep rejoicing to degree you share [koinonia] Christ's sufferings
                           a] this joy is but a prelude to even greater joy at Final Revelation of His glory
